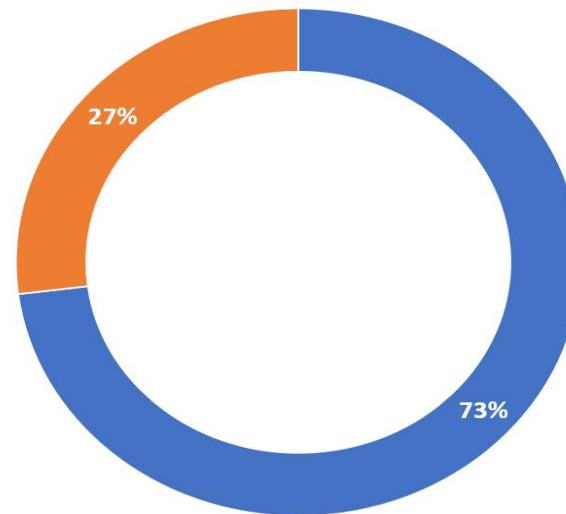

Survey of 172 Irish IT pros on GDPR and information security (TechBeat, in association with Ward Solutions, March 2017)

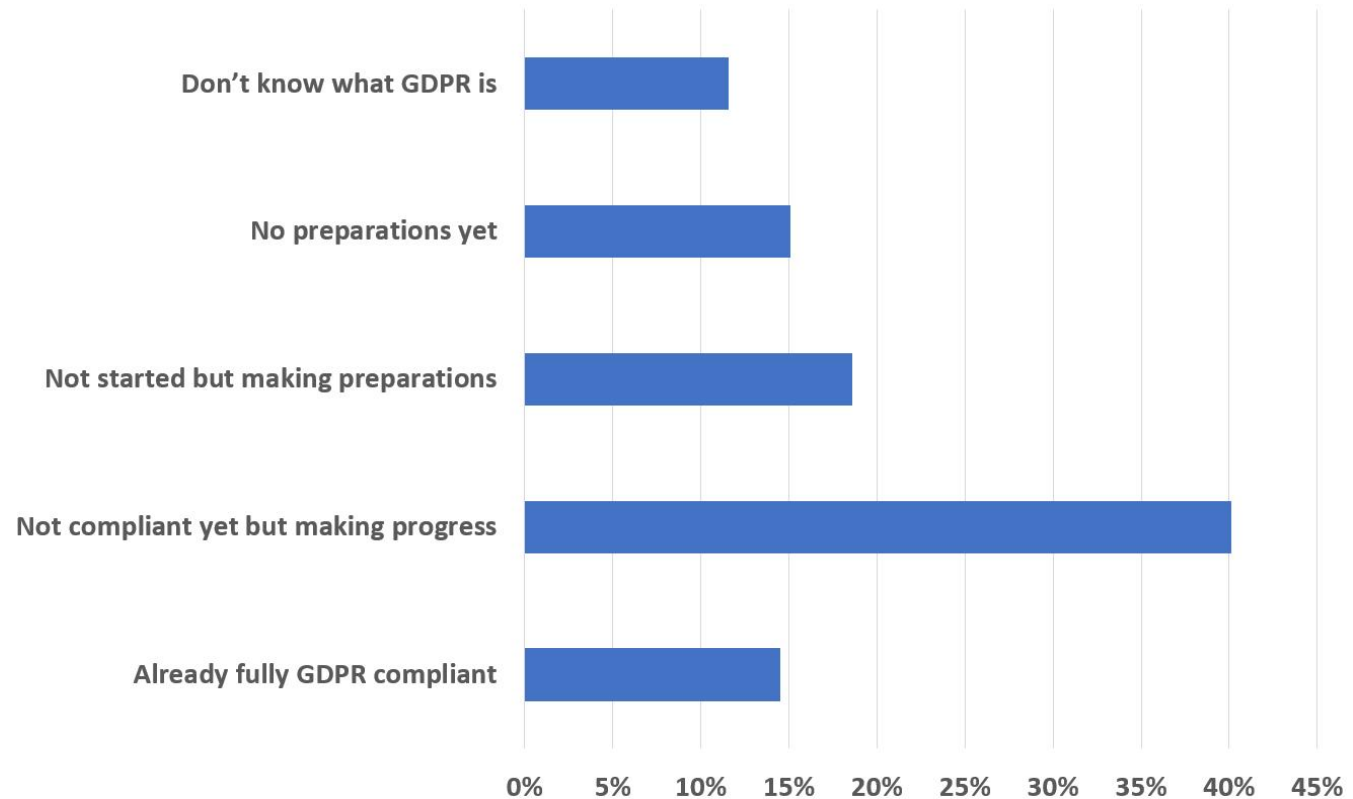
Does your organisation collect any personal data on Irish or European residents?



■ Yes ■ No

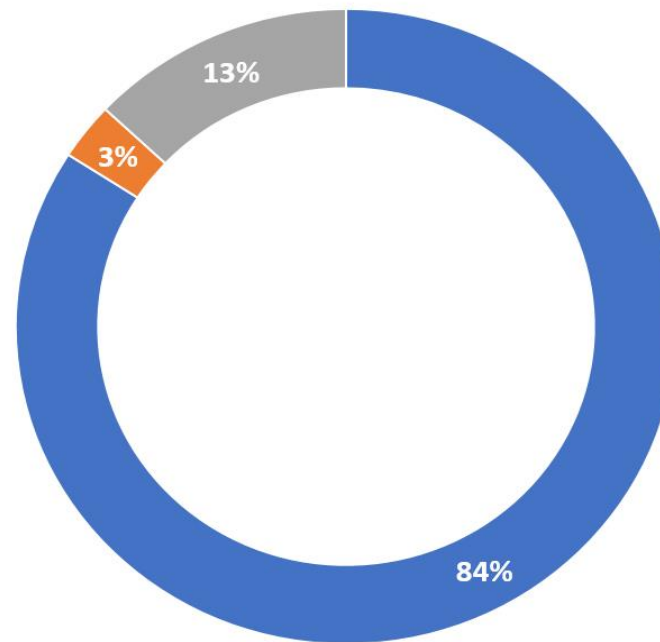
## GDPR: How?

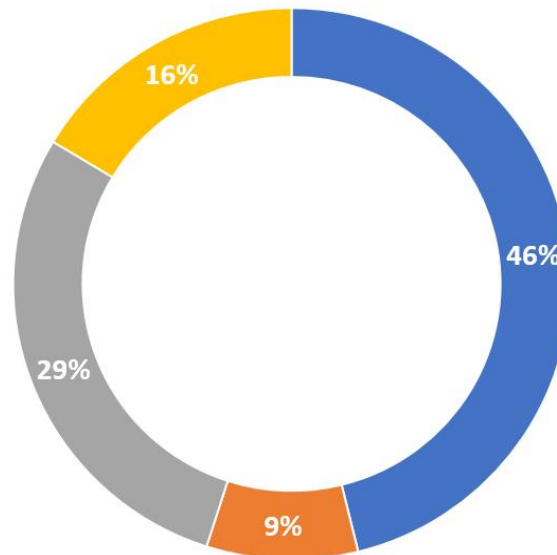
Do you know where the PII your organisation collects is stored?

## GDPR: How?

Do you have the necessary in-house IT resources to achieve GDPR compliance?

- “The DPO is a key advisory role in an organisation, providing internal guidance on the identification of and mitigation of risks to personal data privacy.

“They must be independent of day to day management, to the extent that they cannot receive instruction from anyone in relation to the performance of their tasks and they cannot be dismissed or penalised for carrying out their functions as a DPO,”
